

1. AMENDMENTS IN NRAI MATCH BOOK AND ARE EFFECTIVE WITH IMMEDIATE EFFECT.

1.	1.1.2	The National Rifle Association of India shall organize competitions at Zonal/all India level competitions namely Zonal Championships, All India Kumar Surendra Singh Inter School Shooting Championship, All India G V Mavlankar Shooting Championship (AIGVMSC), National Shooting Championship Competitions (NSCC), Kumar Surendra Singh Shooting Championship in Big Bore/Small Bore/Shotgun events, Digvijay Singh Memorial Shooting Championship, India Open Competition as per ISSF/IPC/NR/Deaf Rules. The Governing Body may modify the said rules to suit the local conditions.
2	1.1.2.1	<p>The level of the competitions is defined as under:</p> <p>(i) National Level Competition:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> National Shooting Championship Competitions (NSCC) – the highest-level competition, the National Championship – held once in a year. Kumar Surendra Singh Shooting Championship – All India level Championship. All India Kumar Surendra Singh Inter School Shooting Championship – All India level Championship for school students. Digvijay Singh Memorial Shooting Championship Any other Competition, as approved by NRAI. <p>(ii) Pre-National Competitions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> All India G V Mavlankar Shooting Championship (AIGVMSC) India Open Competition Zonal Championships: Zonal Championships organized on a regional basis, grouping of participants from specific geographical zones of India – East, West, North, South and Northeast Zone. Any other Competition, as approved by NRAI. <p>(iii) State Level Competitions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> All State Championships organized and conducted by affiliated State Rifle Association. Pre-State Championship Any other competition organized by State Rifle Association, affiliated to NRAI.

3	6.10	The Event, Category and Match are defined as under: i. Events, as recognized by ISSF (like 50M Rifle Prone) ii. Category – Age categories, as approved by the Governing Body of NRAI iii. Match – Match consists of Event and Category as per (i) and (ii) (Like 50M Rifle Prone Junior Men)
4	17.10	If a shooter is not qualified for a specific event and attempts to register for it on the NRAI portal, he/she will incur a penalty of Rs. 5000/- (plus GST as applicable). Participation in the event will be denied to the shooter, and Shooter ID of the shooter will only be reactivated for other events upon payment of the penalty.
5	17.13	a. Participation in 50M Pistol Women/Junior Women in NSCC: Shooters who are Renowned Shooter in both 25M Sports Pistol and 10M Pistol events will be allowed to participate in NSCC without participation in AIGVMSC/ZONAL CHAMPIONSHIP OR INDIA OPEN COMPETITION. b. 25M Standard Pistol Jr Women: The Junior women shooters may participate in 25M Standard Pistol Junior events if they are Renowned shooter 25M Sports Pistol events. c. All other shooters, who wish to participate in above events, must achieve MQS as per Rule 1.4 and 17.6 of NRAI Match Book during State/AIGVMSC/ZONAL CHAMPIONSHIP/INDIA OPEN COMPETITION for participation in NSCC.

2. A new category has been introduced for Women and Junior Women (Services) during AIGVMSC/Zonal Championships.

3. In view of the amendment under Rule 17.13 of NRAI Match Book, the following matches have been introduced during AIGVMSC/Zonal Championship/India Open Competition in 50M Pistol and 25M Standard Pistol (Juniors) for women with following MQS under Rule 1.4 and 17.6 of NRAI Match Book:

4. The revised rules for participation in India Open Competition.

The highlights of the new rules are as under:

- a. Shooters who have participated in **Pre-State Championship/State Championship/AIGVMSC/ZONAL CHAMPIONSHIP/INDIA OPEN COMPETITION** or NSCC may participate. In case any State fails to conduct Pre-State Championship, the NRAI reserves the right to allow shooters of that state to participate in India Open Competition.
- b. No team events to be conducted in any Match.
- c. During July and October, NR Matches in Fire Arm events will be conducted to facilitate to achieve MQS under 17.6 of NRAI Match Book for participation in NSCC.
- d. In other editions of India Open Competition, events in air weapon and shotgun will be conducted.
- e. Participation in ISSF Matches is as per Clause 17.6.1 of NRAI Match Book.
- f. Shooters participating in NR matches will be able to achieve MQS under 17.6 of NRAI Match Book for participation in NSCC

5. The Road Map for the conduct of all NSCCs:

All State Championships must be completed by 31st July every year.

All Zonal Championships to be completed by September

All India G V Mavlankar Shooting Championship in October

NSCC to be held in November, preferably from 5th November, depending on international competitions.

6. Revised definition of Renowned Shot on certificates for NSCC

“It is certified that he/she is eligible for Duty Exemption as a Renowned shooter in term of Government of India Notification no. 146/94-Cus dated 13 July 1994.”

7. RULES FOR CONDUCT OF PRE-STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

During the discussions on participation in India Open Competition, there was a proposal to encourage State Rifle Associations to conduct Pre-State Competitions with an objective to bolster grassroots participation and skill development among shooters. Through this initiative, State Rifle Associations would be able to provide frequent opportunities for shooters to practice and compete, enhancing their readiness for State Championships. These competitions would serve as a screening process, ensuring shooters meet Minimum Qualifying Standards (MQS) set by State Associations before participating in State Competitions. By organizing these championships regularly, State Associations not only promote increased participation but also generate additional revenue, thereby fostering the growth and sustainability of shooting sports at the state level.

The Rules for conduct of these Championships are as under:

1. The periodicity of the Pre-State Championships will be bio-monthly basis.
2. The States hosting Pre-State Championship must publish details of competitions on their website (if available) or inform their affiliated Distt. and NRAI.
3. Entries must be accepted through the portal of NRAI and scores of such competitions must be uploaded during the competition. No scores can be uploaded after the close of the competition.
4. Shooters, who participate in Pre-State Championship, will be eligible to participate in India Open Competition.
5. No recommendation for grant of arm license, as Aspiring Shooter, can be made on the basis of performance in Pre-State Championship. Recommendations for grant of arm license can only be made based on performance in State Championship, which is conducted once in a year.
6. The States may award medals, as decided by the State Rifle Association.
7. Entry fee as per NRAI Match Book.
