## **MINUTES OF THE GENERAL BODY MEETING HELD ON 20<sup>th</sup> DECEMBER 2023**

The virtual Annual General Body meeting was held on Wednesday, the 20<sup>th</sup> December 2023 at 15.30 hours transact the agenda, as circulated.

The members, as annexure, attended the meeting.

The Senior VP presided over the meeting and welcomed the members present in the meeting.

He apprized the House about some of the best performances by the shooters in international competitions in recent past. The shooters, so far, have won 13 Quota places for 2024 Olympic Games. The quotas in Rifle events have been maximized - the 8 quotas, which never happened in the past. Three Pistol and two shotgun shooters have won quotas. We hoped that our shooters will win the quotas in remaining two Quota competitions.

The performance in Asian Games 2023 was hailed praised worthy. Shooters created history by winning 22 medals in Asian Games 2023. Indian contingent won 107 medals and shooters contributed 22 medals in the overall Indian medal tally. India stood 4<sup>th</sup> in overall Medal Tally. In the overall medal tally of World Championship, India stood 3<sup>rd</sup> after China and Ukraine. For India, it was one of the best performances during World Championship at Baku, Azerbaijan. Indian shooters won 6 Golds and 8 Bronzes with the tally of 14. The credit goes to the shooter, the coaches, the support staff team, and all of you.

The NRAI is working to take corrective measures learning from the last few Olympics cycles. We are consistently monitoring, evolving ourselves and flexible enough to work with changing reality of shooting as well as individual shooter and sport. The Government is hopeful the shooters would be able to get medals for India and glory to nation.

In recently concluded 66 NSCC, there were around 12000 shooters participated in the nationals. It is again a huge achievement despite the fact very high MQS are fixed for Nationals. The credit goes to all state associations for promoting sports in various ways in their own states. The NRAI will move forward and make shooting much more coveted, much more appreciated and there is much more to be achieved in the years to come.

He congratulated Mr. Aishwarya Pratap Singh and Ms. Esha Singh for Arjuna Award which was conferred by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports.

The requested the Secretary General to start the proceedings of the meeting. The Secretary General welcomed the members and started the proceedings of the meeting.

### **1. To approve the minutes of the Annual General Body meeting held on 17<sup>th</sup> December 2022**

The minutes of the AGM held on 17<sup>th</sup> December 2022 were circulated along with the agenda. Shri D V S Rao proposed that minutes of previous AGM be taken on records. Shir K T Singh seconded the proposal of Shri D V S Rao, the minutes were approved unanimously.

2. **To approve the report of the Secretary General, NRAI for the year 2022-2023.**

The Secretary General informed that his Annual Report, which was circulated earlier, may be taken as "read" and requested the members to approve it. Shri D K Shukla proposed, and Shri Amarjang Singh seconded, the Report of the Secretary General for the Financial Year 2022-23 was approved unanimously.

3. **To adopt and confirm the accounts for the financial year 2022-2023.**

The Financial Accounts were considered and discussed by the Governing Body of NRAI and after thorough discussions, the Governing Body forwarded the same to General Body for approval. Shri Gaurav Sarin enquired about high expenditure on Misc. Sports Promotion expenses compared to previous financial year. Shri Ashok Pandit raised on high expenditure towards legal expenses and justification on payment to one of the NRAI ICC members. Shri Ashok Pandit also raised about the custom case, which is pending for a very long time and efforts should be made to get this case closed. The Secretary General clarified that some other entities, which have similar grounds in custom case, had gone to Supreme Court, hence proceedings of NRAI case were kept pending. Since the Supreme Court has remanded the case to Delhi High Court, hopefully this case will get disposed off. The Secretary General further clarified that due to large number of legal cases, the expenditure was incurred. Shri D V S Rao proposed that the accounts may be passed subject to furnishing details of expenditure towards Misc. Sports Promotion and legal expenses. The Senior VP assured the members that the details of both the accounts will be sent to all members of the General Body. With this, Shri Gaurav Sarin proposed and Shri Ashok Pandit seconded, the accounts for the Financial Year 2022-23 were approved by the General Body of NRAI unanimously.

4. **To appoint Auditors for the financial year 2023-2024 and fix up their remuneration.**

M/s Nath Ahuja & Co. have offered their services for the Financial Year 2023-24 and have requested for an enhancement in their audit fee from Rs. 75000/- to Rs. 1 lakh. The last enhancement was in the financial year 2020-21. Shri D V S Rao proposed, and Shri Pawan Singh seconded, M/s Nath Ahuja & Co. CA were appointed as Chartered Accountants for the Financial Year 2023-24 on a remuneration of Rs. 1 lakh plus taxes, as applicable.

5. Any other point with the permission on of the Chair.

- a. Shri V K Dhall asked for consistence in changing the selection criteria and should not be changed frequently. Ms. Sheila Kanungo replied that all policies are discussed in Technical Committee and in Governing Body after thorough discussions approved the policies. The Sr VP said that policies are not changed frequently, as stated by Shri Dhall. Any change, as and when required, is discussed and placed on the website of NRAI. He assured Shri Dhall that he would look into this matter.
- b. Shri Gaurav Sarin said that, despite not being member of the Governing Body, he respects the decisions of the Governing Body and matter related to Governing Body should not be raised in the General Body.

The Senior Vice President thanked the members for attending the meeting. On a parting note, he informed the members that the NRAI got two very good offers for sponsorship from Walther and Capapie. He said that during his visit in North Zone Shooting Championship and NSCC, he noticed huge crowd at Equipment Control office shooting rushing to fix the jacket at the last minutes. He directed the NRAI office to increase the number of officials in Equipment Control office to reduce the rush and talked to Capapie to provide NRAI a facility for fixing/repairs of jackets/trousers in NRAI House for shooters so that they can check their equipment well in advance and not to rush for fixing the same as per ISSF Rules. M/s Capapie have agreed, and negotiations are on for sponsorship with them for providing services to shooters at NRAI House and get a reasonable sponsorship from them.

The other sponsorship is with M/s Walther. The MOU has been signed with them and they have agreed to supply weapons following conditions:

Free of cost weapons to top shooters  
50% discount to certain number of shooters  
25% discount to NRAI for weapons for its affiliated units.

The interest of shooters, affiliated units and NRAI is paramount and final contract will be signed after due discussions.

The meeting ended with vote of thanks to Chairs.

## MINUTES OF THE ZOOM MEETING OF THE GENERAL BODY MEETING ON 18<sup>th</sup> DECEMBER 2024

A meeting of the General Body of National Rifle Association of India was held on 18<sup>th</sup> December 2024 at 3.30 pm on zoom.

The members, per Annexure "A", were present during the meeting.

The President welcomed the members and requested the Secretary General to start the proceedings of the meeting.

### 1. **To approve the minutes of the Annual General Body meeting held on 20<sup>th</sup> December 2023**

The Secretary General requested the members to consider approval of the minutes of AGM held on 20<sup>th</sup> December 2023. Shri Gaurav Sarin, member from Delhi State Rifle Association, said that minutes under Agenda item 3 of the meeting were not recorded correctly. He said that he had proposal to approve the financial accounts for the year 2022-23 "subject to providing details of legal and Misc. Sports Promotion expenses". The last line of Agenda item 3 of the minutes should have been read as "proposed by Mr. Gaurav Sarin and seconded by Mr. Ashok Pandit, subject to providing details of Legal and Misc. Sports Promotion Expenses".

The Secretary General clarified that, as desired by Mr. Gaurav Sarin, the details of legal expenses were provided to all members of the General Body vide email dated 27<sup>th</sup> December 2023.

With these observations, Shri D V Seetharama Rao proposed, and Shri Gaurav Sarin seconded, the minutes of the Annual General Body meeting held on 20<sup>th</sup> December 2023 were approved unanimously.

### 2. **To approve the minutes of the Annual General Body meeting held on 21<sup>st</sup> September 2024**

Shri Gaurav Sarin proposed, and Shri Amarjang Singh seconded, the minutes of the meeting held on 21 September 2024 were approved unanimously.

### 3. **To approve the report of the Secretary General, NRAI for the year 2022-2023.**

The Secretary General briefed the House on the activities of the NRAI during the period 2022-23. The report of the Secretary General was approved unanimously.

### 4. **To adopt and confirm the accounts for the financial year 2023-2024, as recommended by the Governing Body of NRAI.**

The Governing Body, in its meeting held on 12 November 2024 recommended the Financial Accounts for the year 2023-24 for approval to the General Body of NRAI. Copy of the Financial Accounts was circulated along with Agenda. Shri Gaurav Sarin said since accounts for the FY 2022-23 were not approved, approval of FY accounts 2023-24 cannot be considered at this stage. He suggested that a Special General Body meeting be convened for approval of accounts for these two years after receipt of forensic report from auditors on legal expenses. The matter was discussed at length. Shri D V Seetharama Rao pointed out that the General Body in its meeting held on 20<sup>th</sup> December 2023 approved the accounts for the FY 2022-23 with the condition that details of "Legal Expenses and Misc. Sports

Promotion expenses" would be furnished to members. The details were furnished through email on 27<sup>th</sup> December 2023, so the Financial Accounts for 2022-23 were unconditionally approved by the General Body on 20<sup>th</sup> December 2023. Moreover, the House under Agenda 1 above, have already approved the minutes of the meeting on 20<sup>th</sup> December 2023. Under these circumstances, there was no need to convene a special meeting for approval of the accounts. Shri Pawan Singh said that demand of Shri Gaurav Sarin for forensic audit was made during the course of elections of the President NRAI in September 2024 and not during the meeting held on 20<sup>th</sup> December 2023. He reiterated that the Financial Accounts for FY 2023-24 were also approved during the 20 December 2023 meeting. He emphasized that the demand for a forensic audit should not be conflated with the approval process for the Financial Accounts of FY 2022-23 and FY 2023-24.

The House, after discussions, Shri D V Seetharama Rao proposed and Shri Amarjang Singh seconded, the Financial Accounts for the year 2023-24 were approved. The sole dissent of Shri Gaurav Sarin was recorded.

5. **To appoint Auditors for the financial year 2024-2025 and fix up their remuneration.**

M/s Nath Ahuja & Co. have offered their services for the Financial Year 2024-25 with fee of Rs. 1 lakh plus taxes, as applicable. Shri D V Seetharama Rao proposed, and Shri Pawan Singh seconded. M/s Nath Ahuja & Co. were appointed as Chartered Accountants for the FY 2024-25. Shri Shashank Kaurani, while agreeing to appointment of M/s Nath Ahuja & Co., suggested that Chartered Accounts must be rotated after 5-6 years as a matter of good governance practice. The suggestion of Shri Shashank Kaurani was noted, and appointment of noted.

6. **Any other point with the permission on of the Chair.**

- a. The President informed the House about activities preceding this meeting. He lauded the performance of the shooters during Olympic Games 2024 supported by their coaches and support staff, who brought glory to the country and created the history. Manu Bhaker became the first women to win 2 medals in one Olympic Games.

He said that with the approval of the Governing Body, the NRAI is going to start Shooting League of India, which would be first of its kind in the world. He informed that process to appoint marketing partners and other professionals was on and hope to start the League by March 2025. He would be constituting a committee of experts in this regard.

The President informed that the ISSF has formed a Committee on E-Sports, E-Games and Technological Innovations and it is focused on its growing popularity virtually. For this purpose, the NRAI is required to take all necessary steps in this regard. The first E-sport Olympics are taking place in Saudi Arabia. The NRAI must start working on this. The President informed the House that for these activities, there was a need to amend the Constitution of NRAI and process, as defined under Rule 35 of Rules and Regulations of NRAI would be initiated shortly.

The President said it is heartening to note that record number of 13000 plus shooters are participating in ongoing 67 NSCC at Delhi and Bhopal ranges. He congratulated, Maharashtra, Rajasthan, Haryana, UP and Punjab State Rifle Associations for fielding large number of shooters during 67 NSCC. Shri Shashank Kaurani requested that efforts should be made so that shooters get training on PET days. He suggested that number of manpower should be increased to conduct the competition more professionally.

The President asked Shri Pawan Singh to brief the House on conducting NRAI judges' courses in the last two years. Shri Pawan Singh thanked the President and informed the House about the activities of NRAI Education Department. In the last half and a year, the NRAI has trained 110 judges and have conducted international "B" course last year and the same will also be conducted in June 2025. There will be EST course in February and March 2025 which will be conducted by ISSF nominated instructors. The NRAI has suggested to ISSF, apart from coaches, it should include judges, range administrator, gun smith, marketing, sport science courses also. The NRAI is working on signing MOUs with Asian Shooting Confederation and ISSF to be their knowledge partner. It would be big step to become a knowledge partner for the neighboring countries.

The President informed the House that Melbourne University has approached NRAI to jointly structure and conduct courses of sports management, sports administration and sports ethics and governance. For NRAI, it would be helping Melbourne University to structure this course but in return we would be asking some seats for our shooters/members. If any of the shooter/member is interested to doing degree and diploma in sports, the NRAI would assist them. The discussion with Melbourne University is still on.

The President informed that Shri Pawan Singh and Shri Amarjang Singh for have been elected as member of ISSF Judges and Shotgun Committees. The members congratulated both the officials.

Meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.

## MINUTES OF THE GENERAL BODY MEETING ON 4<sup>th</sup> DECEMBER 2025

A meeting of the General Body Meeting of the National Rifle Association of India was held at 11 am on 4<sup>th</sup> December 2025 at Hotel Park Plaza, Zirakpur, Ambala Chandigarh Highway, Distt. Mohali, Punjab.

Present in meeting were:

Mr. Kalikesh Narayan Singh Deo, President welcomed the Observers from ISSF, IOA and members of the newly formed General Body of NRAI.

The President briefed the House on key initiatives and milestones achieved during the tenure, which have significantly strengthened the growth, professionalism, and international standing of Indian shooting sport.

He highlighted the launch of the Shooting League of India, a landmark initiative to promote shooting at a professional level, enhance visibility, and attract greater participation and sponsorship. Emphasis was laid on capacity building, with the successful conduct of ISSF Rifle/Pistol Judges Course and two ISSF Electronic Scoring Target Courses in New Delhi, strengthening the technical workforce nationwide.

He informed the House of his appointment as a Member of the Mission Olympic Cell (MOC), Sports Authority of India, reinforcing NRAI’s role in national sports planning. He also mentioned about election of Mr. Pawan Singh and Mr. Amarjang Singh to the ISSF Judges Committee and Shotgun Committee respectively.

Progressive reforms in competition structure were outlined, including the introduction of the 25M Sports Pistol Men event in NSCC, the event which may be part of the 2032 Olympic programme, and the reduction of Minimum Qualifying Scores to encourage wider participation and talent development.

The President highlighted strengthened international collaboration through the MoU with the ISSF Academy, and further advancement of coaching education with the allotment of the ISSF “B” Coaches Course to be held in New Delhi in January 2026. He thanked OGQ for financial support for running the coaches and jury programs.

He said successful hosting of the ISSF Junior World Cup, New Delhi 2025 has received appreciation from the ISSF for organizational and technical excellence. He also informed the House of the record participation in the 68th NSCC, with around 17,500 entries, reflecting the sport’s growing popularity.

Outstanding international performances by Indian shooters in 2025 were acknowledged, with 171 medals won, and special mention was made of Ms. Manu Bhaker, who became the first female Indian athlete to win two medals at a single Olympic Games. In 2024 Olympic Games, Mr. Swapnil Kusale and Mr. Sarbjot Singh won individual and Mix Team bronze medals also.

Finally, he informed the members about securing major international events for India in the coming years, including the Asian Rifle/Pistol Championship 2026, ISSF World Cup with Olympic quota places in 2027, and the ISSF Junior World Championship in 2028.

In conclusion, the President stated that effective governance and a commitment to excellence have laid a strong foundation for the future growth of shooting sport in India. He thanked the members for their continued support and expressed confidence in their ongoing cooperation.

He then requested the Returning Officer to start the proceeding of the meeting.

Justice Nirmaljit Kaur (Retd), Returning Officer (RO) thanked the members for their cooperation in conducting the nomination process and hoped the same while conducting the elections.

The RO informed the House that there are 58/68 members present for the General Body while the quorum of the General Body, as per Rules and Regulations of Constitution of NRAI is 15 members.

### **MINUTES OF THE EMERGENT GENERAL MEETING ON 28<sup>th</sup> DECEMBER 2025**

In accordance with the Rule 26(a) of Rules and Regulations of Constitution of NRAI, Emergent General Meeting (virtual) was convened on 28<sup>th</sup> December 2025 at 11.00 am.

The members, per Annexure "A", were present during the meeting. A total of 30 members were present in meeting.

The President welcomed the members to the first meeting of the General Body of the National Rifle Association of India during the present tenure. He hoped for a productive and purposeful tenure ahead with the active support and cooperation of the members.

He informed that the coming period holds several important competitions and initiatives for the Association. He was confident that with the collective involvement, guidance, and commitment of all members, the NRAI will continue to scale new heights and further strengthen shooting sports in the country.

He said that the reason for convening the Emergent General Body Meeting was that as per the Rules and Regulations of the Constitution of NRAI, the financial accounts for the year 2024–2025 were required to be approved by the General Body on or before 31st December 2025. Owing to the elections of the Executive Committee and Governing Body held on 4th December 2025, and considering the mandatory requirement of a 30 days' notice for convening a normal General Body Meeting, it was not feasible to hold the meeting earlier. Hence, it became necessary to convene this Emergent General Body Meeting.

Shri D. V. Seetharama Rao appreciated the dedicated efforts and hard work of the previous Governing Body and requested that the same be placed on record. The President sincerely appreciated and acknowledge this gracious gesture.

The President then requested Shri Pawankumar Singh, Secretary General, to take over and commence the proceedings of the meeting.

The Secretary General thanked the President and started the proceedings of the meeting.

- 1. To approve the minutes of the Annual General Body meeting held on 18<sup>th</sup> December 2024 and General Body meeting held on 4<sup>th</sup> December 2025.**

The minutes of the Annual General Body meeting held on 18<sup>th</sup> December 2024 and General Body meeting held on 4<sup>th</sup> December 2025 were circulated to all members of the General Body. The Secretary General requested the members to consider approval of minutes of both the meetings. Shri Amarjang Singh proposed and Shri Kumar Tripurari Singh seconded, the minutes of the meetings held on 18<sup>th</sup> December 2024, and 4<sup>th</sup> December 2025 were approved unanimously.

2. **To approve the report of the Secretary General, NRAI for the year 2024-2025.**

Report for the Financial Year 2024-2025 by Shri K Sultan Singh, former Secretary General was circulated through email on 16<sup>th</sup> December 2025. Shri Pawan Singh, Secretary General expressed his sincere appreciation to Shri K. Sultan Singh Ji for his dedication and tireless efforts during his tenure as Secretary General, and hoped that he would continue to guide and support the Association in the future as well.

Referring to the contents of the report, he noted that the sport of shooting is steadily growing and reaching new heights, with Indian athletes winning medals across all international arenas, including a special mention of the three medals secured at the 2024 Olympic Games. He then requested the members of the General Body to kindly consider and accord their approval to the report.

Shri D V Seetharama Rao proposed and Shri M S Bhangle seconded, the report of the Secretary General was approved unanimously.

3. **To adopt and confirm the accounts for the financial year 2024-2025, as recommended by the Governing Body of NRAI on 24<sup>th</sup> October 2025. Copy of Financial accounts is attached.**

The Financial Accounts, on the recommendations of the Finance Committee were adopted by the Governing Body, in its meeting held on 24<sup>th</sup> October 2025. These were circulated to members along with the agenda. The Secretary General requested the members to consider approval of the same. Shri M Rachandra Singh proposed, and Prof V C James seconded, the financial accounts for the year 2024-2025 were approved unanimously. .

4. **To appoint Auditors for the financial year 2025-2026 and fix up their remuneration.**

During the last AGM on 18<sup>th</sup> December 2024, it was decided to appoint a CA in place of M/s Nath Ahuja and Co. for the FY 2025-26. The Secretary General proposed that M/s Dinesh Bajaj be appointed as CA for the FY 2025-2026. The Company has confirmed their availability for FY 2025-26 and asked for a fee of Rs. 1,75,000+ GST +Out of Pocket allowance. After negotiations, M/s Dinesh Bajaj and Company have agreed for a fee of Rs.1.50 lakh+ GST + out of pocket allowance. Shri M S Bhangle proposed and Shri M Rachandra Singh seconded the proposal, M/s Dinesh Bajaj were appointed as Chartered Accountant for the Financial Year 2025-2026 with professional fee of Rs. 1.50 lakh plus GST plus out of pocket allowance.

5. **To consider recommendations dated 25<sup>th</sup> October 2025 of the Governing Body for creation of Executive Committee and to amend Rules and Regulations under Constitution of NRAI accordingly. Copy of proposed amendments is attached herewith.**

The Secretary General requested the President NRAI to brief the House on proposed amendments in Rules and Regulations of Constitution of NRAI.

The President informed the General Body that while the process of configuring the elections was underway, the new Sports Governance Act had been introduced and passed by Parliament. However, the Act was promulgated, pending notification of its implementation, as the Rules, Regulations and the constitution of various authorities under the Act had not been put in place at that time.

He stated that he had detailed discussions with the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports (MYAS), including the Hon'ble Minister and the Secretary, and also noted that several legal matters were still pending, including the *Rahul Mehra vs. Union of India* case and related judgments. The MYAS, on the request of NRAI, granted permission to hold elections within three months from the due of elections – latest by 18<sup>th</sup> December 2025, in view of the above impasse.

Keeping these developments in view, an in-depth consultation was undertaken under the leadership of Shri K. Sultan Singh, Secretary General, with legal experts associated with these cases. Based on these consultations, it was decided that, in consonance with the judgments of the Hon'ble High Court, the existing Sports Code, and the spirit of the forthcoming law, a 15-member Executive Committee be constituted in terms of the applicable criteria, as per law of the land.

He emphasized that the NRAI has to be in compliance of the legal framework, judicial directions, and governance reforms prevailing at the relevant time. He further recalled that in the previous two meetings of the Governing Body, resolutions had already been passed in this regards.

The President explained that, accordingly, 11 members be elected directly, while 4 members would be inducted from the sportspersons category i.e. Sportspersons of Outstanding Merit (SOM) and Shooting Athlete Committee (SAC).

The President requested the General Body to consider and approve the proposed amendments, as circulated along with the agenda.

Shri D.V.S. Rao congratulated the President and appreciated the clear and comprehensive explanation, noting that NRAI is among the first sports federations in the country to align itself with the new governance framework.

Shri Kumar Tripurari Singh proposed and Shri Lalremtuanga seconded, the amendments, as per Annexure "B" were approved unanimously.

The President thanked all the members for their participation in the meeting. He said that although he would have preferred to convene the meeting in person, considering that a meeting had been held about fifteen days earlier, it was felt that it would not be appropriate to request members to travel again to Delhi, particularly in view of the prevailing weather conditions and pollution. He therefore appreciated the understanding of the members in holding the meeting virtually.

The President confirmed that there were no further items on the agenda and accordingly declared the meeting closed. He concluded by extending his warm wishes to all members for a very Happy New Year.

Meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
