**66th NATIONAL SHOOTING CHAMPIONSHIP COMPETITIONS (NSCC) (SHOTGUN EVENTS), AT
DR. KARNI SINGH SHOOTING RANGES, NEW DELHI, 2023**

GENERAL REGULATIONS

1. ORGANIZERS

The National Rifle Association of India shall be organizing and conducting the 66th NSCC (Shotgun Events) from 21st October to 30th November, 2023 in accordance with the rules of ISSF and NRAI Match Book. These rules are available on the websites of ISSF and NRAI.

2. VENUE

The 66th National Shooting Championship Competitions (NSCC) in shotgun events will be held at Dr. Karni Singh Shooting Ranges, New Delhi as under:

GROUP 1 TRAP EVENT	FROM 21ST TO 24TH OCTOBER, 2023
GROUP 2 TRAP EVENT	FROM 25TH TO 28TH OCTOBER, 2023
GROUP 3 AND MIX EVENT TRAP DOUBLE TRAP	FROM 15TH TO 19TH NOVEMBER, 2023 FROM 20TH TO 21ST NOVEMBER, 2023
GROUP 1 SKEET EVENT	FROM 22ND TO 25TH NOVEMBER, 2023
GROUP 2 SKEET EVENT & MIX EVENT	FROM 26TH TO 30TH NOVEMBER, 2023

3. NEW ISSF RULES

In the previous rules for the Trap event, after an athlete fired his shot at the target on Station 1, he was permitted to load his cartridges into the barrel on Station 1 itself and then move to station 2 with an open but loaded gun and so on for the entire duration of the match.

NEW RULES 9.2.2 CARRYING SHOTGUNS

a) **Cartridges must not be loaded in the shotgun until the athlete is standing on the shooting station**, facing the machines with the shotgun pointed towards the target flight area and after the Referee has given permission

b) 9.2.7 EYE AND EAR PROTECTION

All athletes and other persons in the vicinity of the firing line must wear ear plugs, ear muffs or similar adequate ear protection.

- c) Hearing protection incorporating any type of sound-enhancing or receiving devices may not be worn by athletes or Coaches on the FOP. Hearing impaired athletes may wear sound-enhancing devices with the approval of the Jury (see also G.T.R. 6.2.5.
- d) All athletes, Referees and Officials should wear shatterproof shooting glasses or similar eye protection.

9.9.2 Method

- h) Any athlete who loads his/her shotgun on a fired station before leaving it, or carries his/her shotgun loaded between any stations must be given an initial **Warning (Yellow Card)**; any further occurrences until the end of the Qualification process will result in **Disqualification (Red Card)**;
- i) Any athlete who loads his/her shotgun on Station 6 must be given an initial **Warning (Yellow Card)**; any further occurrences in the competition will result in **Disqualification**;

9.16.3 TECHNICAL VIOLATIONS

In the case of initial technical violations during a competition round such as:-

- 1) Foot fault
- 2) Exceeding the time limit allowed to call for the shot:
- 3) In Skeet, the athlete's READY position is not according to the rules
- 4) In Skeet, on station 4 the athlete opens the gun between the two (2) single shots(this does not apply on station 8)
- 5) Following or pointing with the gun at a slow or fast pull target without shooting.
- 6) A warning (yellow Card) will be shown to any offending athlete by a Referee. This must be indicated on the relevant scorecard before it is sent to the RTS office with the use of the below abbreviations while at the same time the Referee must submit also a completed incident Report form.

FF = Foot Fault

TL = Time Limit

SKRP Skeet Ready Position

OG = Opening the gun between 2 singles **FPG** = Following the Pointing the Gun at al slow or fast target

- 7) For each second or subsequent technical violation, of the same kind in any stage of the Competition (qualification or Final) of any of the technical violations listed above, the athlete must be penalized by the deduction of the (1) point (Green Card) by the Referee.
- ii) **IT IS MANDATORY FOR ALL ATHELETES TO WEAR EAR PROTECTION (EAR MUFFS OR EAR BUDS) AND SHOOTING GLASSES. ANYONE NOT ADHERING TO THE ABOVE WILL BE PENALISED FOR AN OPEN VIOLATION**

4. SCHEDULE

From last year, a new format has been introduced and competition will be conducted as per new format on following dates. The athletes have been divided into 3 groups (Trap) and 2 Groups (Skeet) to enable to conduct the competition as per model schedule recommended by ISSF. The Double Trap event will consist of 120 targets for Men/Women and all categories. There will be no Final in the Double Trap Event.

- ALL ATHLETES WILL MANDATORILY SHOOT ON DAYS ALLOCATED FOR THEIR GROUP (GROUP 1,2 OR 3) ONLY.
- ALL ATHLETES, IRRESPECTIVE OF DIFFERENT CATEGORIES, THEY HAVE ENTERED, WILL SHOOT ONLY ONCE DURING THE COURSE OF THE NSCC.
EXAMPLE: ATHLETES REQUIRED TO PLAY IN GROUP 1, WILL ONLY PLAY ON DAYS SCHEDULED FOR GROUP 1. THEY CAN NOT PLAY IN ANY OTHER GROUP/S. THIS WILL APPLY TO ATHLETES OF ALL GROUPS.
- SENIOR MASTERS/SUPER MASTER ENTERED IN SENIOR MASTERS AND MEN/WOMEN CATEGORY, WILL MANDATORILY SHOOT ONLY ON THE DAYS ALLOTTED FOR THE SENIOR/SUPER MASTERS EVENT (GROUP 1) AND THEIR SCORES, HOWEVER, WILL BE COUNTED TOWARDS BOTH THE CATEGORIES.
- MASTERS ENTERED IN MASTERS AND OPEN MEN/WOMEN CATEGORY WILL MANDATORILY SHOOT ONLY ON THE DAYS ALLOTTED FOR THE MASTERS EVENT (GROUP 2) AND THEIR SCORES, HOWEVER, WILL BE COUNTED TOWARDS BOTH THE CATEGORIES.
- ALL ATHLETES IN JUNIOR AND SENIOR CATEGORIES WILL MANDATORILY SHOOT ONLY ON THE DAYS ALLOTTED FOR THEIR GROUP AND THEIR SCORES WILL, HOWEVER, BE COUNTED TOWARDS BOTH THE CATEGORIES. (FOR EXAMPLE, ATHLETES WHO QUALIFY FROM AIGVMSC/ZONAL CHAMPIONSHIP WILL SHOOT UNDER GROUP 1 MATCHES, WILL BE ELIGIBLE TO SHOOT THE FINALS, IF THEY RANK WITHIN FIRST 8 POSITIONS UNDER THEIR CATEGORIES)
- AT THE END OF COMPETITION, (AFTER GROUP 2 (SKEET) AND GROUP 3 (TRAP), A CONSOLIDATED RANKING LIST WILL BE PREPARED AND FINALISTS FOR EACH CATEGORY WILL BE SELECTED TO SHOOT THE FINALS.
- THE TOP 06 ATHLETES WILL PLAY THE FINALS OF THEIR RESPECTIVE CATEGORY, AS SCHEDULED (IRRESPECTIVE OF WHICH GROUP THEY PLAYED IN) NO FINALS FOR DOUBLE TRAP EVENT.
- FOR TEAM EVENTS IN TRAP, SKEET AND DOUBLE TRAP RANKINGS WILL BE DECIDED AS PER QUALIFICATION SCORE ONLY. THERE WILL NOT BE ANY SEPARATE MATCH/FINAL FOR THE TEAM EVENT
- FOR PURPOSES OF BEING DECLARED A RENOWNED SHOT, AN ATHLETE MUST ACHIEVE MQS AS PER RULE 17.6 OF NRAI MATCH BOOK. ATHLETES WHO FAIL TO ACHIEVE MQS AS PER THE STATED RULE 17.6 OF NRAI MATCH BOOK WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO IMPORT ANY ARMS/AMMUNITION

5. PARTICIPATION

- a. Participation is open to competitors from State Rifle Associations/ Units affiliated to NRAI. In case where no State Rifle Association exists, competitors belonging to clubs directly affiliated to NRAI will be allowed to participate. NRAI members must take part through State Rifle Associations/ Units of their native place otherwise

their entry will not be accepted. However, if there is no such Association / Club functioning in their State, they can take part as members of NRAI provided they have paid all their dues towards NRAI.

- b. State Rifle Associations/Units will allow the members of NRAI to participate in the competitions organized by NRAI without becoming a member of that State/Club to which he/she belongs subject to the member undertaking to follow all the rules and regulations applicable to the shooters of that State. The State Rifle Associations/units may also charge an additional fee equal to entry fee of the competition but not more than Rs. 5000/- for forwarding the entries of Life/Annual Members of NRAI. This is applicable when these shooters are not members of State/Unit or any District/club to which Members of NRAI wish to represent. The Members of NRAI must have achieved MQS as defined for each competition under NRAI Match Book.

6. AGE CRITERIA

Shooters, who are completing the age, as stated below in 2023, will be allowed to participate under age categories matches:

- e. **SHOOTERS BELOW THE AGE OF 12 YEARS ARE NOT ALLOWED TO PARTICIPATE DURING THIS CHAMPIONSHIP.**

7. ELIGIBILITY

Shooters qualified, as per Rule 17.6 of NRAI Match Book are eligible to participate in this NSCC.

Shooters furnishing incorrect information shall be Debarred from taking part in any Shooting championship/competition for Two years including blocking the Shooter ID account.

8. ENTRY

- a. Those shooters, who have not received/ applied for their Shooter ID number, must immediately visit our website www.thenrai.in to check status/apply for their Shooter ID number.
- b. **SHOOTERS, WHO ARE ALREADY IN POSSESSION OF SHOOTER ID, ARE NOT REQUIRED TO APPLY FOR FRESH ID REGISTRATION AND ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED ON EXISTING REGISTRATION.**
- c. The entries will be accepted through respective affiliated State Rifle Association/Units only. Entries will only be accepted through “NRAI’s ONLINE SYSTEM” and no paper entry will be accepted. The Shooters are required to visit our website www.thenrai.org to file their entries along with online payment of entry fee. The online entries with normal fee will be accepted till **07.30 PM on 16th OCTOBER 2023**. Late entries with triple entry fee will be accepted till **07.30 PM on 18th October, 2023**.
- d. Shooters may send email to NRAI office for any assistance on email ID indiashooting@gmail.com
- e. Juniors can also participate in senior category with the payment of additional entry fee as per rules.
- f. Shooters, who achieve ISSF MQS as per Rule 17.6 of NRAI Match Book will be notified as “Renowned Shooter”.
- g. Entry fee will not be refunded except in the event of the match being cancelled. The entry fee should be paid “online” only and no cash/draft will be accepted. Shooters will be permitted to shoot only in the details and lanes allotted to them. No requests regarding change of firing points/relays/dates will be entertained.
- h. **Foreign Nationals must part in matches, specifically for Foreign Nationals and are not permitted to participate in National Championship matches. In case of any violation, the shooter will be disqualified from participation in this NSCC.**

Team events will be conducted in accordance with Rule 18 of NRAI Match Book. Only one Team from each State/ Unit will be allowed in each event irrespective of the number of participants in National Championship Category. Final entry of three members of the team must be submitted latest by 17.00 hrs. on **our online portal** www.thenrai.org

11. MIXED TEAM EVENTS

The Mixed Team events will be conducted as per ISSF Rules. All affiliated units which wish to enter must file their entries as under at **NRAI Camp office at Dr. Karni Singh Shooting Ranges, New Delhi** Only one team, consisting of one male and one female of the same state/unit, can be fielded. Entry fee is Rs. 6000/-(plus 18% GST = Rs.7080/-) per team.

12. PROTESTS AND APPEALS

The Protests and appeals will be dealt as per ISSF & NRAI Match Book . The Protest fee is Rs. 200/- plus 18% GST = Rs.236/-) and in case of appeal to Jury of Appeal, the protest fee is Rs. 500/- plus 18% GST = Rs.590/-).

13. AMMUNITION

- a. The ammunition will be issued to the Team Manager only against cash payment on valid Arms Licenses of Associations/ Clubs/ Individuals or proper special permit issued by the Licensing Authorities. In case of inadequate authorization, special permits for the required quantity are obtained from the Local Licensing Authorities. Unused rounds and empties of used rounds are to be returned to NRAI without any exception.
- b. In extra ordinary circumstances, the Organizing Secretary may grant permission for use of a common weapon. The names of shooters likely to use common weapon should be advised together with the weapon number to the Organizing Secretary in advance to enable him to work out details for conduct of relevant matches.

14. ACCOMMODATION

Participants are requested to kindly make their own arrangements for accommodation. A wide range of hotels for all budgets are available in New Delhi

15. GENERAL

- a. All participants are requested to go through the above instructions carefully and ensure strict compliance.
- b. All participants are expected to abide by the rules and regulations for the competition. Discipline on and off the field is very essential.
- c. Amount of Rs. 200/- plus 18% GST = Rs.236/-) will be charged if a shooter loses his/her competitor card during the competition and fresh card will only be issued on payment of duplicate card fee.
- d. In case of non-participation by the competitors after submission of their entries will not be allowed any refund of the Entry Fee.
- e. Shooting kit (clothing & Equipment) of the competitors during the competition will be strictly according to ISSF Rules.
- f. Shooting practice in hotels is strictly prohibited. In case of any violation, disciplinary action shall be initiated and shooter may be debarred from taking part in NSCC.

- g. Accompanying person/personal coaches are not permitted to enter the Field of Play (FOP).
- h. The Organizers will have the right to close any match or event in case of any emergency or otherwise without assigning any reason for such an action on their part.
- i. The Organizing Committee reserves the right to amend the rules at any time at its sole discretion for events/circumstances beyond its control. Any decision made by the Organizing Committee in any such matter will be final. All participants are expected to abide by the rules and regulations for the competitions. Discipline on and off the field is very essential. Shooting practice in hotels is strictly prohibited.
- j. Scores of this NSCC will be considered for selection of National Squad and international teams under the Selection Criteria which will be published before the start of the NSCC.
- k. The Selection of National Squad and international teams will be done in accordance with the Selection Policy.
- l. No request for any adjustment shall be entertained. The details of squads will be notified on the website of NRAI. Shooters are required to enter the range 90 minutes before the reporting time at range so that they can report on time for their detail.
- m. **Mr. Arvinder Brar, father of Mr. Namanveer Brar has announced a cash award of Rs. 31000/- to the shooter who shoots the highest QUALIFICATION SCORE in Trap Senior Men event. The award amount will be paid by Mr. Arvinder Brar directly to the shooter.**

n. COVID PROTOCOLS:

Due to COVID – 19 conditions, shooters are requested to strictly follow SOPs as laid down by Govt. of India/Delhi Govt. as and when in force.

16. CODE OF CONDUCT

- a. Be a responsible human being and a committed sports person.
- b. Be respectful towards fellow shooters, officials, Coaches, support staff and staff of NRAI.
- c. Be punctual and diligent and adhere schedule timings.
- d. Follow directions by officials.
- e. Shall be dressed appropriately in a dress code prescribed by ISSF.
- f. Be disciplined on and off the field.
- g. Must not verbally abuse or intimidate in any form such as shouting making gesture, towards or in any other way distract any spectator, tournament official, technical official, opposing coach or opposing team official, or opposing player
- h. Shall not indulge in any political or religious and other discourse/discussions/display.
- i. Should not make any inappropriate or unwanted physical, verbal, or sexual advance towards anyone.
- j. Adhere to rules as set by Govt. of India/Sports Authority of India/NRAI or any agency related to the Championship.
- k. Shall abide by the Code of Ethics of ISSF.
- l. Should not consume alcohol or tobacco at range.
- m. It's the responsibility of the shooter to be aware of all the rules and be responsible for their equipment being as per ISSF regulations.
- n. Shooter is responsible for following all rules/norms and go through the notices issued by NRAI at Range/Website of NRAI.

- o. Adhere WADA/NADA rules and not to use drugs, which are not permitted under WADA/NADA rules.
- p. In case of any grievance, please contact the Director of Competition, as per details given below.
- q. Shall not interact with media in any form or over any print/electronic/social platform or post any material, which is contrary to the spirit of IOC Charter, ISSF Rules, shooting sport, fellow shooters, coaches, other office bearers of NRAI and against the policies of Govt. of India/SAI/NRAI.
- r. Must not bring the shooting sport into disrepute through media that relate to tournament officials, technical officials, opposing coaches or team officials and or players, that are personal in nature, imply bias, or question their integrity.
- s. Violation of above may lead to cancellation of entry of this Championship.
